### Volunteering

To ensure a safe environment for everyone, we kindly remind all volunteers to complete the necessary background checks. Your involvement makes a big difference, and we are so grateful for your time and willingness to help as chaperones on field trips, etc. Thank you for helping us create a wonderful learning community! Here are the links for the required background checks which are completed online:

- 1. A completed Child Abuse Register search, which can be found here
- A certified and true copy of a Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector Check available <u>here</u>, from your local Police or RCMP detachment or through online organizations endorsed by Nova Scotia law enforcement agencies

Please note: the Child Abuse Register Search and Criminal Records Check must be issued in the three months preceding volunteering and updated every three years.

### Drop-in Flu-Shot Clinic for SSES Students and Families Friday, November 20th

On Wednesday, November 20<sup>th</sup> we will be hosting a flu-shot clinic for SSES students and families who wish to get a flu-shot. A registered pharmacist will be administering them between 2:45pm-4:30pm at the school on that day. This is voluntary for families to do after school, there is no obligation. We are offering our school site for this clinic as many families do not have access to a family doctor. More information will be provided in the upcoming weeks.

### Parking Congestion on Normandy and Highland During Arrival and Dismissal times.

With the colder weather upon us, we are seeing an increase in car traffic as students are getting dropped off. Please consider walking to school with your child(ren). We have more students than ever before which means we have more staff who are parked in the permitted areas on Normandy and Highland. Other than the temporary parking by the Excel doors on Highland Ave. there is no parking in front of the school or along the playground on Normandy St. Lately, both sides of the street have cars parked for an extended period making visibility difficult for traffic passing through. Please also refrain from parking directly in front of the Main Entrance as this our designated bus drop-off and pick-up location.
