

What we know so far...

Masks, Sanitizer and Signage

All students in grades 4 to 12 will be required to wear a mask inside school except if they are seated at their desks while two metres apart and facing in the same direction. Masks must be worn in hallways and other common areas if a two-metre distance cannot be maintained. Students & staff members will each receive two cloth masks upon return to school.

Sanitizer and signs/posters/floor decals will be distributed to schools next week. There will be an installation team that will be in the school over the next two weeks to complete this work.

Assigned Entry/Exits for Class Cohorts

Class cohorts (individual homeroom classes) will be assigned an entry door and an exit. This will be the door they use to enter the building in the morning and throughout the day and the one they use to exit at the end of the day.

Staggered Recess and Lunch

Both recess and lunch will be staggered so that less students are outside on the playground. Lunch will be spread over two hours so that we have less students going outside to play at once. Classes will begin their lunch period at 11:30am, 12:00pm, or 12:30pm.

Ventilation Inspection

School-by-school ventilation maintenance will take place to ensure equipment is operating properly and in good condition. In our case, operations will be inspecting our windows to make sure they all work.

PrePrimary News

Families with students in PrePrimary will be contacted by one of our Early Childhood Educators the week of Sept. 1st. Please note, the supply list on the website is for Primary-Grade 6 only.

Primary Orientation

Unfortunately, due to the ongoing operational work being done in the school to prepare for our September 8th opening, there will not be a primary orientation this year for our new students prior to the first day of school.

Some Final Thoughts

There is no question that this is an exciting time, but also an anxious time for students and their families. A familiar refrain that we have been hearing for the past two months is the need for being patient and flexible. These are easier said than done. Please know that we will continue to update you as we get closer to the beginning of school. In the meantime here are a few things you might consider on getting ready to return to school:

- 1. Help your child get used to wearing a mask.
- 2. Start re-establishing bedtime, wake-up, and meal-time routines this week.
- 3. Reinforce the positive while being understanding of the anxieties. Remember they are being welcomed back to school by a group of professionals who cannot wait to see their students. Our teachers know what is at stake and will vigilantly work to uphold all Public Health orders and ensure a safe return to school.
